Apply until July 15 Apply via <u>uni-assist</u>
 register, pay 75€ fee, upload school-/university leaving documents, language certificate
 → wait approx. 4 weeks to get your *Prüfbericht*/evaluation result

• Applying with Indian school/university documents?

APS certificate is required

 Certificate will not be issued by the time of application (July 15th)?

No problem, you can submit the APS certificate up to the time of enrollment (August 15^{th}).

Start your application as soon as possible and inform us if there is a delay.

You can't make it in time?

Do not panic, you can still enroll and start your studies later.



What you need to know/do

- Late arrivals will not affect your enrolment or studies.
- Once you have been exmatriculated, you must reapply for the next winter semester.
- Pay your semester fee in time for successful enrollment!
- If you will arrive late, please contact your **health insurance** asap and ask for exemption of the contribution until arrival. You will need health insurance - even though you are not in Germany.



Whats next? When can I take which modules?

Some modules are consecutive and require prior knowledge. We advise to take them (if possible) one after the other.

- Winter semester: Modules from 1st, 3rd and 7th semester
- Summer semester: Modules from 2nd, 4th and 6th semester

Final exams can be taken in any semester.

Please talk to the professor who is teaching the module/ seminar you want to be tested in.






Interview: Joachim Gomes

What are you doing at the moment?

I am currently studying the courses and building up my skills to **plan my internship** in the future. But I also love to take part in the **events** organized by the **international office** and <u>AStA</u> in HSHL.

Moreover, with some of mine fellow students, I have recently joined **ELE Fachschaft**, which is the student council for the department. In ELE Fachschaft, together we believe to improve, motivate and develop for a better environment for all.



Why study in Germany?

During and after the COVID times I was planning to develop my knowledge and skills in the field of Electronic Engineering.

When it is about training yourself in the field of engineering, Germany is one of the **leading countries** for it with their rich portfolio and expertise. That is how I got motivated to plan my engineering studies in Germany. Moreover, the lesser **tuition fee** of the public universities was an advantage for self-sponsored students like me.



Your biggest hurdles during your studies. How did you overcome them?

Similar to my many fellow students, for me the biggest hurdle was not being able to join HSHL campus in time due to **delayed visa** processing.

It took me 15 months to reach Germany and due to that I fell behind of two semesters. During those times our university, especially our International Office team was always there, helping us with all the available information we needed. But I we can still make up for the courses that we missed, because we can plan our studies according to our needs and comfort. Thus, nowadays I am enjoying my studies in HSHL and also my life in Lippstadt.



How would you describe your studies in three words?

Educative, interesting and motivating.

I wish I would have known before...

Overloading yourself with study and stress is not always good. Instead of that, try **balancing life** by enjoying every new experience one can ever come across with.

Finding accommodation in Germany requires some effort and for Lippstadt it can be a challenge depending on the time you are coming. Therefore, **starting early** to look for an accommodation is really a good idea.
